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## Student Needs Analysis Map

The following Student Needs Analysis Map is a template (or an example of a template) that can be used to work highlight what resources or tools are needed to meet an individual student's needs. For second level students, it is considered best practice to get the involvement of their family for better results and inclusion.

The Needs Analysis Map allows the institutional team to evaluate their resources, tools, skills, and expertise against the needs of a student (considering their full background to trace the systemic and structural barriers they face, to include trauma, intergenerational trauma, language acquisition, socio-economic status, and any specific learning needs or disability needs). These datasets are evaluated side by side to see what gaps exist, i.e., what areas the school or institution do not meet the student's needs. This then allows the educators and leadership to put a plan in place to meet the student's needs with the resources they do have and allow for planning to gather the extra resources they may need (identified in the gap). This whole process (the Needs Analysis Map) should be written in as positive language as possible (while still acknowledging the gaps and needs) because the student and the parents / families (in the case of second level students) will read it and have a copy / sign a copy.

**IMPORTANT:** Remember to consider GDPR provisions and any data protection legislation that regulates the creation and retention of sensitive personal data in your location.

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Some of the criteria to identify a practice or tool as a best practice can be:

- The practice/ tool has measurable outcomes, results. E.g. 30 of 40 students completed the course/session, dropout rates lower, students' motivation is higher.
- The practice/tool has a positive impact on the student(s), school, community. E.g. an annual charity event is established with the cooperation of the school and local businesses or NGOs.
- The practice/tool has helped in improving students' social or/and economic status. E.g. a job seeker initiative, or a mentorship pairing students and local organisations.

This template can be customised based on the specific needs and resources of your school/institution. It helps to identify the key challenges, available resources, gaps, and a clear action plan to address the needs of socially and economically disadvantaged students. This template is an example; your students may have only some of these needs and your school may have only some of the resources listed.
